Pupil Premium allocation and spending for financial year April 2016-March 2017

For the financial period April 2016-2017 Kings Lodge received a total of £78,380 for total pupil premium

Pupil premium is paid in three cases and at 3 different amounts

Pupils in year R-6 who are in receipt of free school meals or have been over the previous 6 years E6/fsm -£1320

Service/forces children-£300

CLA- children who have been looked after for more than a 6 month period- in Wiltshire we have to make bids for money up to the value of £1900 for CLA

Pupil premium funding is intended to be used for:

Raising the attainment of disadvantaged pupils and closing the gap between them and their peers

Supporting the needs of young people who have parents in the armed forces. Within Wiltshire we are encouraged to spend this on ensuring the social and emotional needs of this group of children before anything else.
