





The first few weeks in school are spent ...

- Learning the rules.
- Making new friends.
- Getting to know the school.
- Finding out what your child already knows and what they can already do.









School Uniform and PE kit

- The school colour is NAVY BLUE;
- Navy blue sweatshirts or cardigans
- White or pale blue polo shirts
- Navy or grey trousers, skirts or pinafore dresses
- Black or navy blue shoes



P.E. kits –the children wear their PE kit to school on their set PE day.

- Yellow T-Shirt with school badge
- Navy shorts
- Plimsolls / daps / trainers
- Navy jogging bottoms for cold weather are advisable



<u>Milk and snack</u> – Children in Reception receive free milk and fruit (milk until children are 5, fruit throughout).

They may bring a piece of fresh fruit / vegetables as a snack.





<u>Water bottles</u> ~ All children are encouraged to bring a drink to school each day in a clean, named sports bottle.

They are encouraged to drink throughout the day.

Every child in Reception and Key Stage 1 is entitled to a free school meal







Arriving at school

- The school day for Reception children begins at 8.45am. Please DO NOT arrive early.
- At the start of the day you are asked to line up with your child at the Trim trail. When it is time, the class teacher will come and collect your child. Your child will then line up with their class.














End of Day

- The end of the school day, for Reception children, is 3.00pm.
- You are asked to line up and wait for your child by the trim trail (just as you do in the mornings). The class will walk out and line-up on the playground. Please wait for the class teacher to release your child to you.





If someone else is collecting your child and they are not on your collection list, please let us know.

Preparing your child for starting school

Encourage independence by making sure that they can:

- Toilet themselves, including wiping their own bottoms (please make us aware if they have a medical need).
- Put on own coat and fasten it
- Put on shoes
- Dress and undress
- Tidy up

Prepare for early reading, writing and number by:

- Recognise own name
- Singing, sharing books and rhymes together
- Counting together
- Encourage them to draw, cut, glue, paint and get messy!
- Play games that involve turn taking, let them lose!



- Please ensure that <u>names are in EVERYTHINGIII</u> <u>If it can come off, label it!</u>
- Send coats EVERYDAY Outdoor learning happens in all weather!
- Sensible shoes and no jewellery.
- **Pierced ears** a small pair of studs may be worn to school. You may wish to remove earrings for PE days but if not, then they must be taped instead for the duration of the PE lesson (please provide plasters / tape if that is the case).
- Wellie boots ~ a pair kept at school would be fantastic!
- Book bags and reading diaries Please send in daily
- Please <u>do not</u> send in rucksacks





Points to note

- <u>School letters</u> will be emailed to you. Please make sure we always have an up-to-date email address for you. Please DO READ the school newsletter.
- <u>Parent Pay</u> ~ The school operates a cashless system. All parents will need to sign-up on-line to Parent Pay (details to follow shortly).
- <u>Head lice</u> it happens! Please check regularly and treat as recommended.
- <u>Toilet accidents</u> they happen too! Children need to be able to clean themselves up independently with adult supervision. If they are in a big mess we may need to call an adult from home. Please provide spare underwear, pants and socks, in book bags.
- If your child is unwell, or has been unwell in the night, please do not send him/her into school.
- Any absence requires a telephone call explaining why.
