Gender:

King's Lodge School is fully committed to supporting each child to grow and develop into a self-confidant young person who is able to access all opportunities available to them.

We have and will continue to support the young people at our school who recognise that they do not fit neatly into society's views of boy-gender and girl-gender.

- We make conversations easy with children and parents and staff
- We educate our children about positive language and behaviour when discussing gender
- We do not put limitations on any opportunities and make every opportunity for the young person to be treated as they wish to be treated following discussion with them and their parents
- We ensure that transition through phases within our own school and to other schools is seamless and well supported

Mental health and wellbeing

King's lodge School puts the health and well being of its children at the heart of all we do in order to ensure that each child is ready to learn and access all opportunities we make every effort to support their mental health as well as their physical health.

- We train and ensure that our ELSA staff work under the supervision of an education psychologist. Our ELSA staff work with children who we are advised are struggling to cope with a variety of events and issues within their lives
- We have trained our staff to use peer massage and breathing techniques to support calm approaches for those who become anxious
- We use nurture techniques within the nurture room to ensure that the pressure can be relieved for those children who are struggling during the school week enabling them to maintain their own high standards of behaviour both during learning and playing

Poverty and progress

King's Lodge School recognises that children who live in families where poverty means that difficult choices have to be made around the use of money can feel less valued and that this state can be perpetuated through their own adult life. We therefore work to ensure that poverty is not a barrier to learning and progress.
